

Appendix C – Key / legend for CAT & SUBCAT

This is still very tentative and needs to be improved before it can be usefully incorporated into the LMGG. Spreadsheets made from CAT and SUBCAT columns can give useful statistics on (for example) the number of Animals (or Mammals, Bird, etc) recorded in the CMGG. The same applies for any other values of CAT or SUBCAT.

- A: Adjective
 - P: Points of the compass / cardinal direction.
 - C: Colour.
 - blank: Other.
- D: aDverb.
- G: Grammatical particle / word.
- N: Noun
 - A: Animal
 - A-B: Bird.
 - A-F: Fish.
 - A-H: Human.
 - A-I: Insect.
 - A-M: Mammal.
 - A-R: Reptile.
 - ABS: abstract.
 - B: body part
 - B-A: Animal.
 - B-H: Human.
 - CAL: Calendrical
 - G: Gods, monsters, mythological or spiritual beings (includes rulers' personal names which are the names of gods).
 - H: Household object.
 - N: Nature term.
 - NB: Number.
 - P: Plant.
 - T: Title
 - TA: title (administrative) – includes royal and noble titles, administrative and warrior ranks, and occupations.
 - TR: title (relationship term).
 - U: Urban
 - U-B: Building name.
 - U-P: Part of placename.
 - U-PP: Urban places – polities/EG's.
 - U-PT: Toponyms (includes both contemporary, real, Classic Maya places as well as well as mythical places; if a toponym is used with *K'uhul Ajaw*, then it will be classed as an EG, even if there are contexts where it is not used as an EG (like with *uhtiiy* and with *aj-*).
 - U-S: Urban structures / sub-structure.
 - X: Abstract & miscellaneous.
- P: Preposition.
- V: Verb.
- blank: unknown class because of unknown meaning.
